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## Amazon Smile

Did you know that when you buy something on Amazon you may be able to help the BT Benevolent Fund at no additional cost to yourself. All you need to do is:

- log in using your normal Amazon account details
- you’ll be asked to select a charity
- in the search box at the bottom of the page enter ‘bt benevolent fund’
- press select

Then each time you buy something from Amazon, as long as you log in via Amazon Smile, Amazon will make a small donation to the BT Benevolent Fund. Everything else is exactly

the same, so no need to change anything else on your account!

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## So far this year

In the first half of 2019 the Fund dealt with 260 one-off requests for help, as well as continuing to pay weekly grants to 215 BT pensioners on very low incomes. 116 of our cases came from current employees and in all we made grants amounting to over Â£430,000.
